

WHY ORDER OF THE ARROW?

As we start a new activity year and welcome many new brothers, we may be helped by looking again at:

THE PURPOSE OF THE ORDER

The Order of the Arrow emphasizes that a good Scout camper is not only proficient in the skills of Scoutcraft but also practices the principles of Scouting expressed in the Scout Oath and Law and in the tradition of Good Turn. Particular attention is paid to cheerful service as an essential to a happy camping experience. True brotherhood exists among those who exhibit these traits in their daily lives.

PRINCIPLES OF THE ORDER

The Order exists primarily as a service organization and especially emphasizes cheerful service in the camping part of the program. It is democratic in character. Boys are elected to membership by the members of their own Scout troop or Explorer post. They elect their own officers, plan their own program, and carry out service projects under their own leadership. Adults act as advisers and counselors but do not run the arrairs of the local lodges. Membership is granted to boys and adults on the basis of "not so much for what they have done but for

what they are expected to do" in service to their fellow men.

Membership in the Order stems from the home unit and serves to strengthen a member's responsibility to his own unit rather than to draw him away in another program of activities and service projects.

The Order of the Arrow is not a secret society. An air of mystery does surround its ceremonies and meetings, but this is done because of its appeal to boys. Scout leaders, clergymen, educators, parents, and others who wish to know the full story of the Order may easily find the answers to their questions by inquiring through their council office.

Spiritual values in the Order of the Arrow seek to glorify the principles of a Scout's duty to God, his country, and his fellow man.

Order of the Arrow membership is contingent upon registered membership in Boy Scouts of America. All members, in order to stay active in the Order of the Arrow, must maintain their registration.

DOUBLE CHECK YOUR ADDRESS LABEL Check the 8 groups of characters on the top line against these explanations: FIRST: Your membership number. It is new. Lean it and use it. SECOND: O.A. Rank (V=Vigil; B=Brotherhood; O=Ordeal) and year you got it. THIRD: Year you first joined the O. A. FOURTH: Your Peninsula Council District (1= Northern; 2=Eastern; 3=Western; 4=Central) FIFTH: Your Troop, Post, or other Scouter job. SIXTH: Month &year of your birth. SEVENTH: O.A. job, if any. EIGHTH: Last digit of the year for which your dues are paid. IF ASTERISKS ARE IN ANY OF THE GROUPS (except Group 7), THEY MEAN WE DO NOT HAVE YOUR COMPLETE RECORD. THAT'S BAD!

Next, check your name and address. Is your name spelled correctly? Do we show both of your initials? Is the address correct and complete, particularly the ZIP code?
