

This year's jamboree is a unique one because it will be held in two separate places to make it easier to be able to go to one of them. Farragut State Park in Idaho (where the 1967 World Jamboree and the 69 National Jamboree were held) and Moraine State Park in Pennsylvania will be the two sites for the double jamboree. 

This first issue of the Kryer is a little overdue and I'm sorry for letting you all down. But until the end of my term I shall try my hardest to put out the best newspaper I can.




CAMPSITE OF THE MONTH

CAMP PEARY

This campground is in a splendid wilderness area on Queen's Creek outside of the Camp Peary fenced area. It is completely primitive, except for a water trailer provided by Camp Peary on the basis of your reservation.

The area is patrolled by military police, so equipment is safe while you are hiking, fishing, or clamming. There is plenty of dead wood for firewood. Parking space is limited; and the trails are pretty rough on cars from where the roadway ends.

To make a reservation, call the Camp Peary operator at 229-2121 and ask about the Boy Scout camping area.

1 cup of sugar


2 rotten tomatoes


