





the steep Eagle Trail.




CHAPTER CAMPING PROMOTION CHAIRMEN:

Let's get a little organization into the organizing. You and your advisor should now be making up your schedules for visiting every troop in your district.






(try this home recipe)

#### BLUEBERRY MUFFINS

2 cups flour, sifted twice
1 cup blueberries, washed and hulled
2 tbs sugar
½ tbs salt
1 tbs baking powder
2 tbs melted butter
1 egg, well-beaten
3/4 cup milk
preheat oven to 375°

Mix ½ cup flour with blueberries and set aside. Add sugar, salt and baking powder to remaining flour and sift 3 times. Stir together melted butter, egg, and milk, then add this mixture, alternately with berries, to flour mixture (tossing lightly) just enough to moisten flour. Do not over - mix. Grease pan and pour batter to 3/4 point in 10 cups of pan. (fillremaining 2 cups with water to prevent scorching). Bake for 25 minutes
