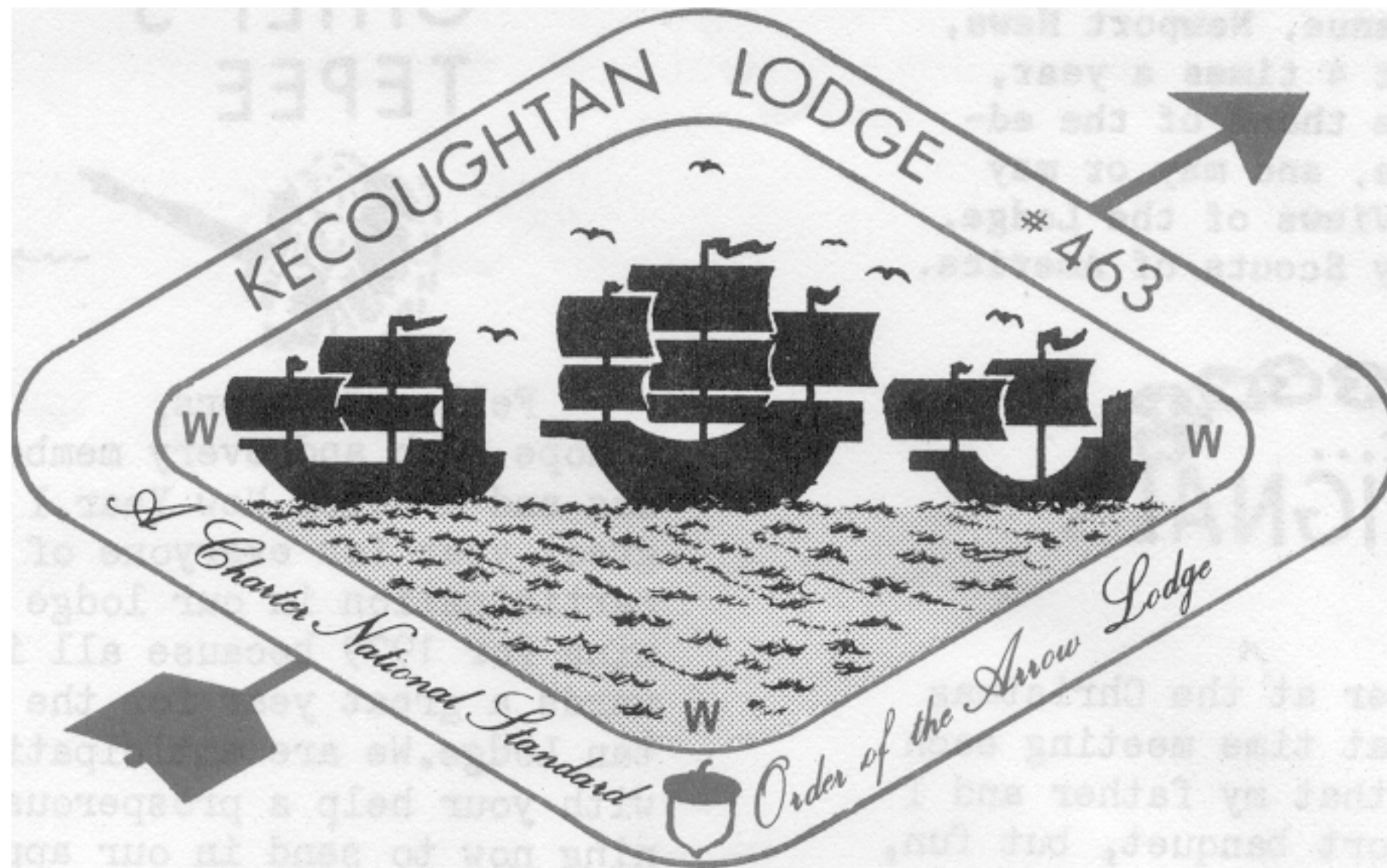

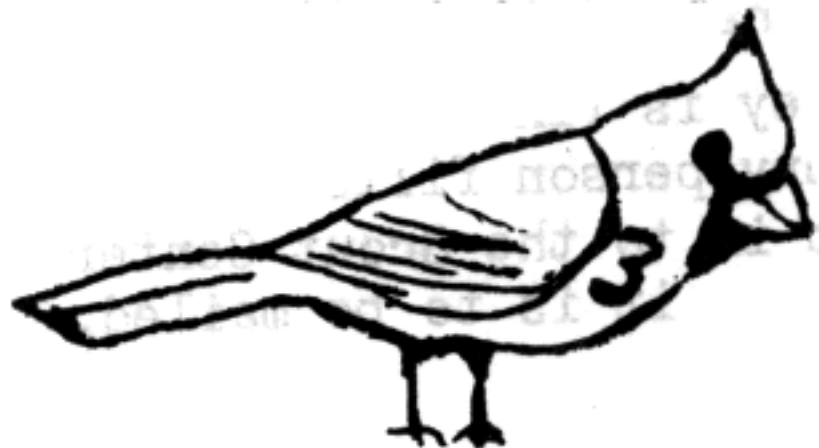

If every present brotherhood member selected one ordeal member, and assisted him on the path to brotherhood, Kecoughtan Lodge would be fulfilling a goal never before realized.

National Conference FACT SHEET

Kecoughtan Lodge Members - Two very important events are happening in 1979 that require considerable lead time in planning.

Number 1 - NATIONAL ORDER OF THE ARROW CONFERENCE, at the Colorado State University, Colorado, 13 through 19 August 1979.

At the Council of Chiefs meeting in November, the advisers of all the lodges in the SE-1 region agreed to initiate a plan whereby all the lodges of the section could attend the conference, travelling together and perhaps have a sight seeing excursion trip in addition to the conference.

Amangamek-Wipit Lodge agreed to formulate the trip plans and came up with the following itinerary. Leave Dulles Airport, Washington, D. C. sometime in the evening of Sunday August 12th - fly to Denver, Colorado, and there by bus to the Conference, which will last until the morning of August 17th. Upon conclusion of the conference, bus to Estes Park to tour the Rocky Mountain National Park where we will spend the night of August 17th - On 18 August we will go to Colorado Springs for a tour of the Air Force Academy, then to Pikes Peak and the Garden of the Gods, then to Cripple Creek, Colorado for a lavish Mexican fare dinner - Leaving Colorado that evening and arriving at Dulles Airport, Washington, D. C. about 7 AM on August 19th - This will get us back to Newport News between 10 and 12:00 AM Sunday August 19th (if we go to Washington D. C. by car).

What is the cost you ask? ? ? ?

\$ 203.00 airfare Washington to Denver and return.

8.00 bus from Denver to Colorado State U.

10.00 early arrival fee at conference.

90.00 conference fee

60.00 two day excursion trip

14.00 miscellaneous expenses.

Please, you cannot wait until May 11th to decide and then pay the total cost, you MUST commit yourself now, by January 19th, by paying the reservation fee or the entire amount if you desire.

Kecoughtan Lodge has looked into other aspects of not going with the section, however, since we only have a delegation quota of twelve delegates and since we are going on a Sunday and returning in the same week, we do not qualify for group rates, the Super Saver or the Freedom Fare flights. Normal fare, coach rate to Denver and return is \$325.00, so the trip planned by Amangamek-Wipit is a sensational offer, especially with the side trip included.

Eight Kecoughtan members have already signed up, and if more than twelve desire to attend, the lodge may be able to obtain additional spaces, but in any event, we must have your confirmed (paid) reservation fee in by January 19th.

Number 2 - SECTION CONCLAVE 1979, at Fort A. P. Hill, Virginia, April 20-21-22.



The planning for the conclave, hosted by Nawakwa Lodge of the Richmond Area Council, is well under way. Kecoughtan Lodge has been allocated a quota of twenty-five, however, additional spaces are available. The conclave is the annual meeting of the twelve lodges in Section SE-1, whose primary objective is training for the lodge leaders. However, there is great fellowship, entertainment and patch trading at every conclave.

The delegation spaces are now open to the membership, first come - first served. The fee for the conclave is \$10.00 plus a small cost for transportation that will be determined at departure time. The delegation MUST be finalized at the February executive committee meeting (February 4th, 7:00 PM, Scout Service Center) and all delegate fees must be in at that time. Refunds after that date will not be given UNLESS you find a substitute to take your place.

Although the lodge had 38 members just attend a spectacular Officers Training event in October, and 10 members just attended a National Leadership Seminar in November, this Sectional event is not one to miss.

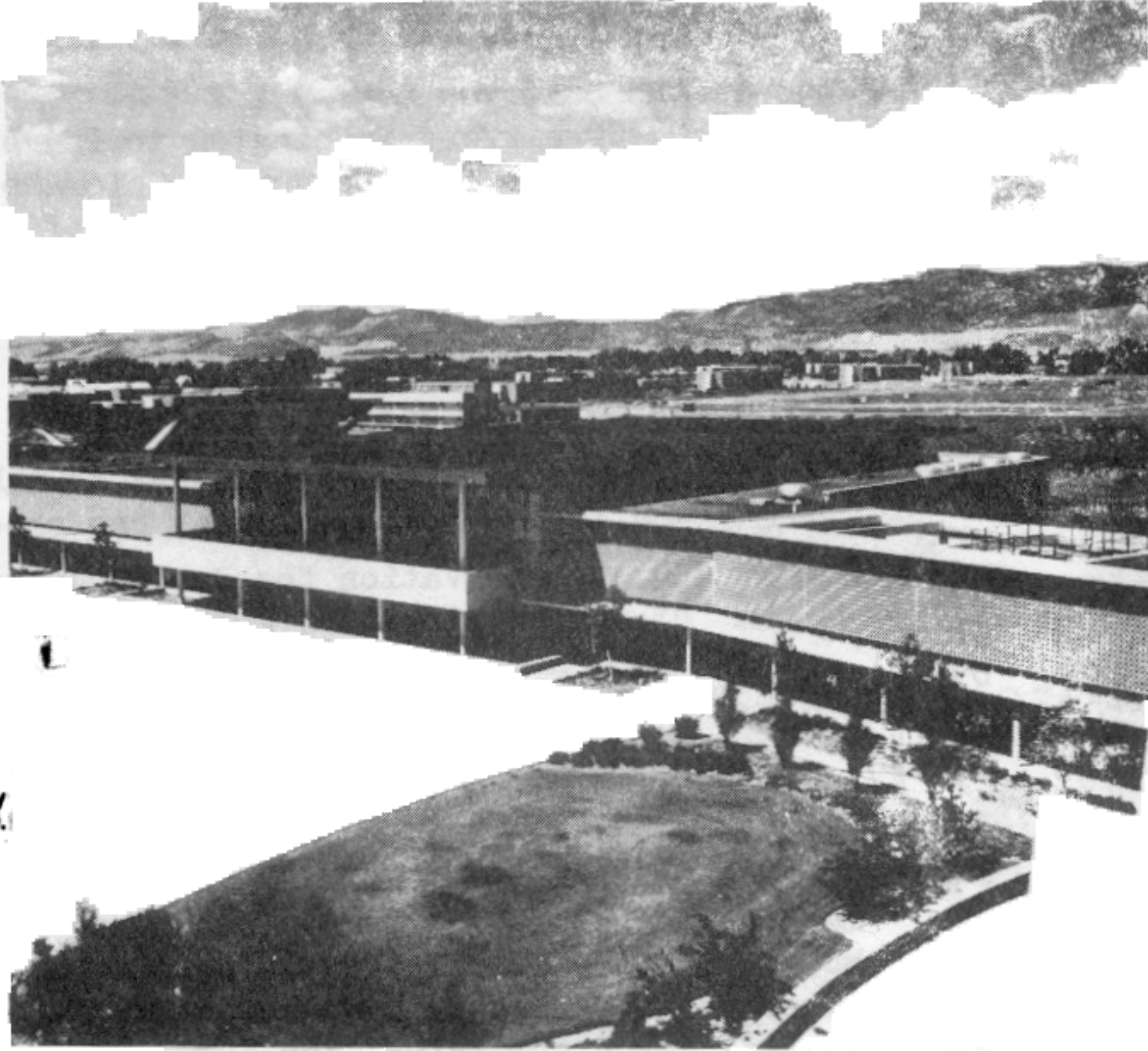

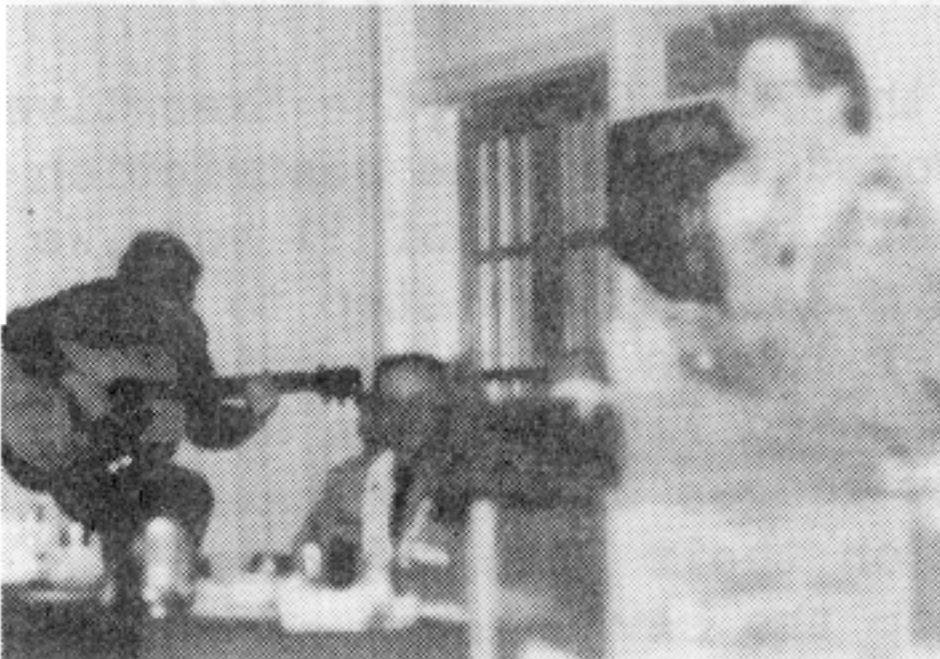
