


WENDAMEN



1983 LODGE GOALS

- To publish a newsletter or bulletin at least quarterly.
- Maintain camping traditions and spirit with a year round camping program and high adventure program. Conduct a camping promotion show in every unit desiring one.
- Conduct unit elections in every unit desiring one by a well trained team of OA brothers.
- At least 50% of the membership attend each Lodge event.
- 5. To have Lodge representation at all the sectional, regional, and national events. Key three to attend the NLS and at least 28 members attend the section Conclave.
- 6. To publically recognize our new members with effective and impressive ceremonies that conform to national policy.
- Insure that at least 50% of eligible members achieve brotherhood.
- 8. Promote the O/A as a resource for new troops and to assist in planning and running camporees or district events at the request of the district committee.
- To crystalize the scout habit of helpfulness by leadership in at least one service weekend and at least three ordeal weekends at camp.
- .0. To furnish youth staff from our lodge to serve the summer camp program and the cub adventure days.
- Provide a minimum of two candidates for each chapter and lodge office in 1983.
- Hold annual lodge and chapter elections followed by an officers training event.
- 13. Promote home unit participation by arrowmen and encourage troops to earn the national camping award.
 - Plan and carry out at least one fellowship.

- 15. Increase participation by scouts at summer camp above the 1982 attendance.
- 16. Provide \$300.00 to the camp maintenance fund through the annual auction.
- 17. Hold a minimum of nine lodge executive committee meetings and maintain accurate financial and membership records.
- Initiate and participate in a community project sponsored by the council.
- 19. Provide an overall quality program for each and every member and earn the distinction of 'National Honor Lodge' in 1983.
- Have every lodge member earn the Lodge Honor Member patch in 1983.






THE OBLIGATION
