


### NEW REQUIREMENTS FOR OA MEMBERSHIP

In a letter dated July 7, 1988 and received in the Peninsula Council on August 4, 1988, the National Committee on the Order of the Arrow changed the membership requirements for induction into the OA. These requirements, which are effective immediately are as follows:

Youth membership shall be under 21 years of age and meet the following requirements:

- (a) Hold the first class Scout rank, as a minimum.
- (b) Have 15 days and nights of camping under the auspices and standards of Boy Scouts of America (Which

includes 6 consecutive days of long term camp) within 2 years prior to election by youth members of the unit to which the youth belongs.

Youth members shall be elected by other youth members in accordance with policies set forth by the national committee of the Order of the Arrow.

All persons under 21 years of age are considered youth members of the Order of the Arrow and shall be elected as candidates for membership based on the youth membership requirements.

Adult membership shall be persons over 21 years of age and they shall be selected as candidates based upon the following:

Adult leaders in units: One adult mat be recommended to the lodge executive committee each year by the unit committee for consideration as a candidate for participation in the induction proc ess provided the following conditions are fulfilled:

- (a) Selection of the adult is based upon ability to perform the requisite functions, and not for recognition of service, including current or prior achievement and position..
- (b) The individual will be an asset to the Order of the Arrow due to demon strated skills and abilities which fulfill the purpose of the Order.
- (c) The camping requirements set forth for youth members are fulfilled.
- (d) The adult leader's membership will provide a positive role model for the growth and development of the youth members of the lodge.
- (e) The unit has had it's annual unit election for youth members prior to recommending an adult.

The Lodge Executive Committee cannot waive any of the requirements foa an adult from a unit.

Adult leaders in council and district positions shall be recommended to the lodge executive committee by the District Chairman, Council President Scout Executive, or members of the professional staff. All requirements set forth for adult leaders in units will be fulfilled with the exception of the camping requirement which may be waived at the discretion of the lodge executive committee.



### RULES CHANGES TO INCREASE DUES

There is a growing need for the chapters to be able to finance the purchase of items susch as ceremonial uniforms. Therefore, the Kecoughtan Lodge Executive Committee voted at their April 9, 1989 meeting to propose an increase in the Kecoughtan Lodge dues. A portion of this dues increase will be credited to the chapters for their use. The following proposals will be voted on by the Lodge Membership at the Spring Ordeal on June 18, 1989.

#### PROPOSAL #1

The current Kecoughtan Lodge Rules state that the annual dues are \$ 4.00 per year and the dues are based on the calendar year. The proposed change will increase the annual dues by \$ 1.00 and will change the due date from January 1 of each year to December 1 of each year. Since the current expiration date of the annual membership dues is December 31, 1989, a late fee will apply only to the members who do not pay their membership dues by January 1, 1990. Thereafter, the late fee will apply to amy membership dues received after December 1.

Revised Section V, Paragraph B, to read: "Annual membership dues for the Kecoughtan Lodge are \$5.00 per year. The annual dues cover the period of December 1 to November 30 of each year. A late penalty of \$1.00 will be added to annual membership dues received after December 1 of each year. One dollar of the membership dues will be credited to the chapter to which the member belongs."

### PROPOSAL #2

It is proposed to increase the Life membership fee from \$ 35.00 to \$ 50.00 per year. If approved, three dollars of this increase will be credited to the chapter to which the member belongs.

Revise Section V, Paragraph C to read: "Life membership in the lodge may be obtained for a one time payment of \$50.00." Add a sentence to read: "Three dollars of this payment will be credited to the chapter to which the member belongs."

If approved, the effective date of these changes will be June 18, 1989.

Induction of adult members shall be at the \ discretion of the lodge executive committee.


