

KECOUGHTAN ELECTS KERSHNER CHIEF

Each year Kecoughtan Lodge elects Lodge officers who are responsible for providing leadership for the coming year. Elections for 1993-94 were held during the Summer Ordeal. The following were elected by the voting members:

- Ryan Kershner, Chief: The new chief is a member of Troop 103 in Williamsburg. He is a past Vice Chief of Piankatank Chapter who entered the Lodge in 1989, served as Membership Secretary, and this past year was 1st Vice Chief of the Lodge. He has been active with the Ceremony Team for three years, usually presenting the role of Meteu. Ryan, an Eagle Scout, was a participant in the 1992 National Order of the Arrow Conference (NOAC). He attained Vigil Honor in 1992 and is currently a senior at Lafayette High School.
- John Athayde, 1st Vice Chief: John is a member of Troop 200 in Grafton. He entered the Lodge in 1991 and currently is a Brotherhood member. John has served on the Ceremony Team for two years, this past year as chairman. His ceremony roles have included Allowat Sakima (Pre-Ordeal and Ordeal) and Nutiket (Brotherhood). The 1993 Summer Ordeal was held at Camp Chickahominy from September 17th to 19th. The event was attended by 142 members and 27 more who came as candidates. Participants enjoyed good food from Tim Bearden (acting chairman) and the Kitchen Crew and good fellowship while achieving important service for our Council's camp.

Sean Vulcan, Service Chairman, reported the service accomplishments for the weekend. These included storage of cots and mattresses, clean-up of the warehouse area, storage of the boats and canoes, clean-up of the spillway, repairs to water lines, and clearing leaves from the roofs. The tents were too damp for storage so future Beaver Days will be required.

Ceremonies are always an important part of any Ordeal. They remind us of our identity with American Indians and of our purpose as a service organization. Our Ceremony Team presented three excellent ceremonies: Pre-Ordeal, Ordeal, and Brotherhood. Thanks to those brothers (John Athyade, chairman; Pat Singletary; Paul Pongratz; Arch Smith; Ryan Kershner; Dan Klapperich; Mike Conley; and Tom Klevecz) who worked long and hard to remind us of traditions. In part of those traditions, 24 members sealed their membership by attaining Brotherhood.

GET READY FOR THE NATIONAL CONFERENCE

The 1994 National Order of the Arrow Conference (NOAC) will be held at Purdue University in Lafayette, Indiana from July 31st through August 4th. This conference, held every two years, is always conducted on a college or university campus, and Purdue, alma mater of astronauts and Nobel Prize winners, is our next host. The conference will feature exciting shows, American Indian events, quality training, and fellowship.

The registration information is due at our Council Service Center this month. Our plans for attendance are now being made and the cost is estimated to be approximately \$350.00 for persons who travel with the Lodge. This includes the fee for the conference, meals and lodging at Purdue, and transportation.

COUNCIL REORGANIZATION IMPACTS ON CHAPTERS

Colonial Virginia Council recently announced a reorganization that reduced the number of districts from nine to five. These changes were driven by substantial reductions in funding the Boy Scouts receive from the United Way and by a BSA goal to have at least 50 units in each district.

The impact on Kecoughtan Lodge is that we usually have only one chapter in each district of the Council. In the consolidation, Denbigh District (Kiskiack Chapter), Two Rivers District (Mattaponi Chapter), and Northern Star District (Wendamen Chapter) will merge. Also, Powhatan District (Pamunkey Chapter) and Ironclad District (Pochins Chapter) will consolidate. These changes were announced during the September Ordeal and officers were elected for the new chapters.





OA AT THE JAMBOREE


Our Order always makes itself felt wherever we go in Scouting and the 1993 Jamboree was no exception. One of the highlights of the event was the OA Rendezvous held on August 5th. Close to 8000 OA members participated in the meeting, held in the arena and hosted by our National Chief, Brian Beaverstock. Other Jamborees have included OA meetings but this was the most elaborate ever. This meeting included a fireworks display that resulted in one of the 60 x 80 foot screens catching on fire. The fire was quickly put out but it did add to the excitement of the show.

This meeting was highlighted by changes in command. The long-time Chairman of the National OA Committee, Dr. Carl Marchetti, announced his resignation and introduced his replacement, Mr. Edward A Pease, a Vice President of Indiana State University. Also, Mr. G. Allen Mossman, the National Associate Director, announced his retirement and introduced his replacement, Mr. Clyde G. Mayer, a professional Scouter.

Another OA feature of the Jamboree was the OA Service Corps. These are selected Lodge members from across America who form special OA Troops at the Jamboree. Arrowmen from these Troops provide a labor pool to act as office assistants, clean-up crews, assist with crowd control, and other jobs. Generally, Scouts in the OA Service Corps have had previous Jamboree experience.

Colonial Virginia Council sent over 160 Scouts and Scouters to the Jamboree. Many of these were Kecoughtan members who enjoyed the overall event, including patch trading our special Jamboree flap patch. The next Jamboree will be held in 1997. (Submitted by Ben Dunton.)

HAVE YOU PAID YOUR 1994 DUES?

Annual dues should be paid before November 30th of the year preceding the year for which dues are assessed. Therefore, the 1994 dues should be paid before November 30, 1993. If a member did not pay his dues for 1993, he should pay the delinquent dues for 1993 (\$6.00) and the 1994 dues (additional \$5.00) at the same time or he may pay the LIFETIME membership of \$50.00.
