CHRISTMAS BANQUET 1994

The Kecoughtan Lodge Christmas Banquet is one of the major events of our Lodge year. The 1994 Banquet will be held December 19th at the American Legion Post 368 on American Legion Drive in Denbigh at 6:30 PM. The menu has not been finalized as of yet, but you can bet the food will be good.

KECOUGHTAN LODGE REFUND POLICY

It is necessary for the Kecoughtan Lodge Officers and Advisers to complete arrangements for each Kecoughtan Lodge event (Ordeal, Banquet, etc.) several days in advance of the event. Therefore, it is necessary for Lodge members to register for the events as noted in each announcement.

After registering, some members may realize that they cannot attend. Kecoughtan Lodge will refund their registration fees under the following conditions: The registered member notifies the Colonial Virginia Council Service Center in a minimum of four days (unless a different time is in the announcement) prior to the event. When this notification is made by telephone, the Lodge member is responsible for recording the name of the person who took the message so that verification, if necessary, can be made at a later date. If the notification is mailed, it must be received at the Colonial Virginia Council Service Center no later than four days prior to the event. If the notification is made in person, it should be in writing.

Refunds for Section and National events such as conclaves and National Order of the Arrow Conferences will be issued only in another Kecoughtan Lodge member is able to attend and take the place of the registered member.

WHEN DO YOU WEAR THE SASH?

The Order of the Arrow sash is worn with official "Class A" uniform or the Scouting's official adult dress wear (a blue blazer and gray slacks). The sash also may be worn by Elangomats who are not in "Class A" uniform at an Ordeal, youth wearing ceremonial attire, and in such other instances as approved by the Scout executive. The sash is worn over the right shoulder so that the arrow is pointing over the right shoulder. The sash is worn diagonally across the chest. It is not to be worn in any other manner. Sashes may not be altered in any way or form. Beading or any other material is not permitted on the sash. Nothing is to be worn on the sash, including signatures, patches of any kind, pins, or legends. The only exception are the 50th and 60th anniversary awards. These may be worn as an option, for those who have earned them, on the shoulder portion above the bar at the point of the arrow.

The sash is worn at Order of the Arrow functions and special Scouting activities, including Courts of Honor and on occasions when members need to be identified as Arrowmen rendering special services.

HAVE YOU PAID YOUR 1995 DUES?

Kecoughtan Lodge has a dues structure of \$5.00 per year when the dues are paid on time. The dues go to \$6.00 per year if not paid on time. An Arrowman can also pay a one-time fee of \$50.00 for LIFETIME membership in Kecoughtan. This lifetime membership is not transferable to the other lodges. Annual dues should be paid before November 30 of the year preceding the year for which the dues are assessed. Therefore, the 1995 dues should be paid before November 30, 1994. Check the label on this flyer. If the upper right hand corner does not have LIFE, 1995 or 1996, you are delinquent dues for 1994 (\$6.00) and the 1995 dues (additional \$6.00) at the same time or he may pay the LIFETIME membership fee of \$50.00. This is the last correspondence you will receive from Kecoughtan Lodge if you are delinquent and if your dues are not paid by the conclusion of the Winter Ordeal which is scheduled for the weekend of February 24-26, 1995.
