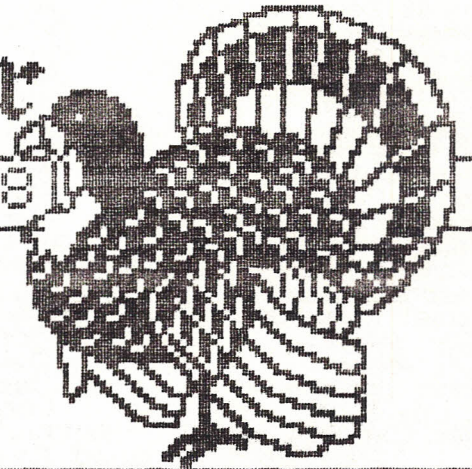

I am excited serving this year of good lodge that to try

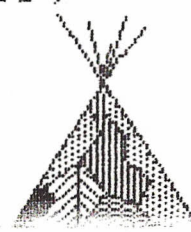
On our year we have a brand new slate of officers, they are ready and willing to do a good job.

Everything is beginning to fall into place for the Christams banquet, although a guest speaker is still in question.

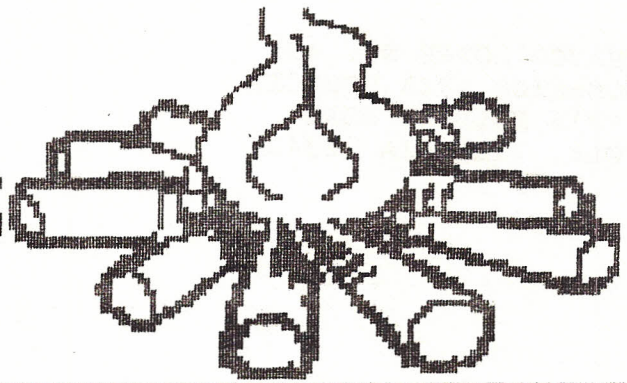
